Brothers,

I hope you all had a Happy Thanksgiving!

There will be a 1st Degree at the meeting on Monday December 20. Let's have a good turnout of candidates; this would be especially good for college student's home for Christmas. Have all candidates at the Annex by 6:15 pm.

St. Theresa's sharing Sunday (when parishioners bring the gifts to Mass) is Dec 4 after the 5:00 pm mass and Sunday Dec 5 after all masses. There is a change this year – the presents brought to each mass will be taken to the Family Life Center Gym (not the Community Center as indicated earlier) immediately after each mass. So, Brothers, try to help carry the presents to the Family Life Center Gym after the mass you attend.

The Clergy Night celebration is on Friday, January 21 at the Stafford Centre (2610 South Main in Stafford), the same location it was held last year. This is an affair where over 1,000 Knights and their ladies will gather to recognize our priests and clergy. A social hour and cocktails will start at 6:30 p.m. with Dinner at 7:30 p.m. The cost is \$30 per person. If you are planning on attending, please notify me ASAP and submit your payment to me prior to December 1.

Last year volunteers distributed cookies to 1200 inmates at the Central prison unit. The cookies were donated by volunteers from over 40 Churches working in the Christian Fellowship Ministry. Guy Baird and John McDonald will be in front of the KC Hall on Sunday December 12th between 8 and 12 AM to collect your cookie contributions; they will be distributed that day. This provides a touch of home to the men confined in prison during the holidays.

Grace Comes in many forms, a note from a dear friend to the Knights of Columbus

I am writing this quick note to give a quick update on the events of recent days and on my dad. I want to thank you for your support, prayers, shoulders, pick me ups and any and all help and assistance you have so lovingly provided over the last ten months while I have been helping my father battle lung cancer.

About three or four weeks ago he got pneumonia on top of the cancer and was too weak to continue the chemotherapy. He was admitted to Methodist Hospital and started treatment. He actually walked into the hospital and into an exam room at that time... He steadily and gradually became weaker and weaker and after a week was transferred to Triumph. The doctors said the pneumonia was cleared up but he still was not recovering. After a couple of weeks at Triumph, he could no longer even get out of bed by himself and often had to be fed.

On Monday his nurse called my brother and me and told us he was exhibiting signs of pending end of life. We talked to Daddy and he decided he did not want to be revived if his heart were to stop. DNR papers were signed.

On Monday night he became very emotional and told us he was ready to go and to "Keep smiling." He told us "good bye" over and over that night. He told the doctor he was tired and wanted no more treatment. We brought him home to his house on hospice service on Tuesday.

Yesterday morning about 6 am he grabbed all of our hands and told us that he was going on a journey. He said there were several people in the room that he knew we could not see them so he was going to tell us about them. (At this time I started praying a rosary.) He said there was "a very big man" holding his hand and "--a beautiful lady with a very beautiful smile." He said he did not know her but she was the most beautiful lady he had ever seen. He described a man with a yamika and another lady with red hair. Then he said they were going to this place and it had "lots of mushrooms that grew all the time." He said it was a very peaceful place. After about an hour he said "We are coming back down." His breathing slowed and he started talking normally again.

As the day went on he became more distant and has now slipped into a coma. The hospice nurses are telling us we are within hours.

I wanted to write this note to let you know what is going on and to tell you about the experience yesterday. It was very emotional to go through but I feel at peace now and think my dad is, too.
